The Art and Art History Department at Wayne State University invites applications for a tenure track Assistant Professor position in Medieval art. The appointment will begin August 2010. Salary is competitive, based on level of experience.

Qualifications: The successful candidate will have a doctoral degree (PhD) in art history, with a specialization in some facet of Medieval art. Previous college level teaching experience is required. Experience in and a commitment to high-quality teaching of a diverse student body at a large, urban university is preferred. An appropriate record of publications, grants, and related professional activities is desirable.

Teaching duties include participating in the survey of Western art history, the development and teaching of intermediate, advanced undergraduate and graduate (M.A.) courses in Medieval art history (covering at least Early Christian through Gothic), contribution to the development of the undergraduate and graduate curricula, advising and recruitment of students, and supervising M.A. theses. The teaching load for art history faculty is four courses per 9-month academic year. Faculty also participate in departmental governance and service at the college and university levels. The university requires faculty to pursue a program of research and publication, including application for external grants.
